# Dear Member

1. As always, as well as providing the opportunity for fellowship and comradeship at our monthly meetings, your Branch has been involved in a wide range of activities around the area showing the flag, raising money for welfare needs and recruiting new members. Thank you to all those members who have attended meetings and assisted in our endeavours. Sadly however I must report that we lost quite a few members through 2019; in particular two of our Life Vice Presidents passed away, Brian Beattie early in the year and Jim Penny more recently. We also lost Roy Dolton, for a long time an active member of the Branch Committee and part of our successful Wings collecting team. We remember with fondness and gratitude all those who have taken their final posting during the year.

2. 2019 saw some major changes in the way that your Association is organized and I expect that you have been following developments in the articles in Air Mail and the Area Newsletter. Our long term Area Director based in Exeter, Paul Baker, has moved on within the Association to start up the Clubs Division, and so we are now looked after by Ailsa Gough from HQ. The Association Welfare team has been re-organised and Richard Peck Hotel closed. There have also been some heated debate over whether the Association should move to One Charity and maybe bring in a One Member One Vote process; so much is happening in the wider Association and your Committee has made inputs to the debates. Your Branch was also represented at National and Area Conferences where we took the opportunity to engage in the discussions; and, of course, Shawn Marston our outstanding Standard Bearer continued to impress as the Association's National Standard Bearer.

Closer to home we once again participated in the Mayor's Service, the Area Battle of Britain Parade and Service at RAF Cosford, the Battle of Britain service in Shrewsbury and the annual Shrewsbury Remembrance Service. Our Branch Secretary also had the honour of laying the Association's wreath at the Cenotaph in London this year. Members were also in evidence at the Shrewsbury Flower Show where we raised funds and recruited new members, at the Armed Forces Covenant Event at Shrewsbury Town Football Club, the Veterans Afternoon Tea at RAF Shawbury, the RAF Shawbury Annual Reception, and a Commemorative Event held at the RAF Shawbury Church. We also had a splendid turn out by members and 1119 Sqn RAFAC cadets at our annual event in Shrewsbury Cemetery to mark the formation of the RAF and to honour the fallen. In addition we were privileged to be involved in a couple of funerals for RAF veterans who had passed away locally with no known family. All of that in addition to our monthly meetings which is always a great way to spend an hour or two with some fantastic people and I do hope that if you have not dropped by recently that we will see you during 2020.
