

Plans are coming together to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the Battle of Britain across our Area and we would like to draw your attention to a couple of key events on the calendar.

On the evening of Friday 21 August our RAF Association Concert Band will be performing in Wells Cathedral, accompanied by the Cheddar Male Choir. This iconic setting will provide a dramatic backdrop for what we hope will be a very enjoyable evening of music and harmony. Tickets will be going on sale towards the end of June and posters will be distributed to all Branches, towns, communities throughout the South West (and Wales and the Midlands if there is interest!). Truro Cathedral will play host to a Service of Commemoration for the 75th Anniversary of the Battle of Britain, on Sunday 13 September at 1400hrs. The RAF Association will be taking a lead role together with RAF St Mawgan and dignitaries from the City of Truro. Music support will be provided by the Royal Air Force Regiment Band and this occasion will also be an opportunity for the newly formed No 505 (Wessex) Sqn Royal Auxiliary Air Force to raise their profile.

Here's the important bit.....we want to create a visually spectacular honour guard of Branch Standards at the steps of the Cathedral. Can your Branch commit its Standard and Bearer(!) to this event? Is there enough interest from your Branch to fill a couple of cars? Access to the Service will be by invitation only and we have a number of seats allocated to the Association. This will be free on a first-come-first-served basis and promises to be a memorable occasion but please make sure you express your interest through the Exeter Office. Please don't just turn up as you will be disappointed. This event is open to all Branches across our Area, conscious, of course, that Truro is a considerable distance for many. If there is sufficient interest we might also form a marching flight of RAF Veterans in order to raise our profile with the Cornish public.



An hour before midnight on Friday, 21st March, 1941, a returning Royal Air Force Bomber crashes onto Dartmoor.

And so begins the fascinating and often emotional story of 'The Boys'. This fully illustrated presentation captures the mood of 1941 and relates the story that lies behind the stark granite memorial that now honours the final resting place of the Royal Air Force Hampden aircraft that crashed there.
