1. MEMBERSHIP UPDATE



6. VACANCY ON AREA COUNCIL

We are sending this out again as the response has been somewhat underwhelming.

Following a recent resignation from Council our Area is looking to co-opt a member from any of its Midland Branches, or indeed a member from our WRAF Virtual Branch, who might live in the Midlands area. Does this interest you?

As you may know, the purpose of Area Council is to oversee the activities of the Association in its area. In our case that stretches from the Staffordshire Moorlands to Lands End and all of Wales and half way across the UK, a huge geographical area. Area Council elects a Representative from its number to sit on Central Council to pass on its views and to contribute to debate over the Association's direction of travel, and to report back on the rationale and background to decisions. The Representative is a Trustee of the Association; the remainder of Area Council are not. Each Branch within the Area has a nominated Area Councillor who feeds into Area Council meetings the views of his or her Branches. Area Council, having determined what they would like to see happen in their Area, then either task their Representative to raise the issue with Central Council; or tasks the Area Director and his staff to make things happen.

Our Area Council is made up of 9 elected members, with 3 representing each constituent part of Wales, Midland and South West. Election to Area Council takes place on a 2 yearly cycle and will be contested again at the 2017 Area Annual General Meeting.

7. BATTLE OF BRITAIN 75TH ANNIVERSARY PARADE AND SERVICE TRURO CATHEDRAL

8. 70TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE LIBERATION OF ALLIED PRISONERS OF WAR – POWS REMEMBERED IN WESTON-SUPER-MARE

This year sees the 70th anniversary of the liberation of allied prisoners of war from German camps. Many of them had been imprisoned for up to five years, often in harrowing conditions, but the process of gaining their freedom was for most, worse than what had gone before. In an episode that seems to be largely ignored in accounts of the Second World War, in the worst weather of January 1945, hundreds of thousands of allied prisoners were force-marched by their German captors for four months, away from the Red Army rapidly approaching from the east. Many did not survive, dying of cold, hunger, brutality or accidental allied air attacks by pilots who thought the columns of men were German troops.

Relatives of former Prisoners of War from all over the UK are gathering in Weston-Super-Mare on 17^{th} and 18^{th} October to commemorate their loved ones and to discover more about their experiences, and what life was like as a Prisoner of War. The event is so popular that it is fully booked and no more places are available. Helping them will be historian Dr. Anna Wickiewicz from the Polish Central Prisoner of War Museum, situated on the site of Stalag VIIIB, one of the biggest POW camps for British and Commonwealth prisoners. Also on hand will be historical researcher Philip Baker, the organiser of this event, who has been researching prisoners of war for 15 years, and has taken many groups to visit former POW camps abroad. The Prisoner of War Weekend is taking place at the Royal Air Forces Association Branch Club HQ in Alexandra Parade, Weston-Super-Mare. It will include an exhibition entitled 'Stalag', which will be open to the public on Saturday 24th October from 10 am – 4 pm.

On Wednesday 21st October there will be an evening reception, presentation and viewing of the exhibition for local dignitaries and members of the RAF Association and other local organisations. Dr Anna Wickiewicz historian and musicologist, has been working at the Education and Exhibition Department of the Polish Central Prisoner of War Museum since 1999. Her PhD thesis was entitled 'Soldiers of the British Commonwealth in German Captivity during World War II'.

Philip Baker served in the Royal Air Force and is a member of the RAF Association. He began his research work into prisoners of war in 2000. His work attracts interest from all over the world, and his Prisoner of War website* has received hits from more than 120 different countries. <u>www.lamsdorf.com</u>.

9. COLLECTING AT MORRISON'S SUPERMARKET

Our Fundraising Department have a message regarding collecting opportunities with the Morrison's supermarket:

A rumour was circulating that, in future, no military charities apart from the RBL will be given permission to collect in Morrison's at any time during the year. This is incorrect – in future stores have been told to allow only RBL collections during the period of the Poppy Appeal only (and therefore not to allow any other charities to collect at this time – military or non-military). However the remainder of the year is open for any charity to apply for a collection in their local Morrison's.

A number of branches had also been given the impression that, from 2016 onwards, Morrison's policy will change to a national partner approach whereby only their national charity of the year will be allowed to collect in store. This is also not the case. The change to their guidance is that they will not accept just a bucket collection on its own - they want to see an informative aspect to the charity's presence in store whereby the charity explains to customers how the money will be used. I know from experience that many of our branches are exemplars of excellent practice and always do this anyway. For those who don't, the Wings Team here stand ready to advise them – including explaining the marketing leaflets/displays which are available to order through the Wings order form/online.

The process of requesting collections/presence in store remains the same – it is devolved locally to individual stores and requests should be addressed to the store's local community champion. Should any branches experience any issues when requesting collections (some stores do seem to have interpreted the Morrison's policy incorrectly), please do refer them to the Wings Team at Leicester who will be happy to intervene on their behalf. Thank you.

12. LATEST RAFALO UPDATE

Here's the latest information on changes to the RAF, provided as ever by one of our senior RAFALOs, Sqn Ldr Ady Morris.

EQUIPMENT AND MANPOWER

Tornado GR4 Squadron Extension. It had been announced that the Tornado Force would reduce from 3 to 2 front line squadrons in March 2015, in line with the planned drawdown of the RAF Tornado Force. Subsequently, it was announced that the third front line squadron would be retained for a year due to the key role the Tornado Force was playing in current operations. Due to the sustained nature of the coalition air campaign against ISIL in Iraq, a decision has been made to retain the third Tornado GR4 squadron for an additional year. This will sustain 3 front line squadrons based out of RAF Marham until 31 March 2017.

Renaming of the Ministry of Defence Hospital Units (MDHUs). Following the closure of UK Military Hospitals the concept of MDHUs embedded within the National Health Service (NHS) was formulated to provide peacetime treatment for Service patients and to assist with training of Service secondary healthcare personnel. Further changes in the NHS under the Health and Social Care Act (2012) have driven significant changes to the way secondary healthcare for military personnel is now commissioned from the NHS. Primary healthcare providers now refer all Service patients into standard NHS secondary healthcare pathways when required. Consequently, the role of the MDHU has moved away from delivering patient care and is now primarily focused on coordinating the delivery of suitably qualified and experienced military secondary healthcare personnel for operations. Accordingly, there is no longer any requirement for the Military Patient Administration Cell (MPAC) and this has been disbanded. Reflecting the changes above, MDHUs were renamed on 1 Aug 15 to 'Defence Medical Group'.

A400M. The third UK A400M took off from the assembly plant in Seville, Spain and landed at its new home at RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire on 5 July. Delivery of the third operational aircraft will allow the RAF to start developing its use, whilst continuing to grow the experience of the aircrew, who will see four more A400M Atlas delivered in the next few months.

Air Seeker. The second Airseeker (Rivet Joint) Signals intelligence plane is expected to be delivered to the RAF in Sep 15, seven months early and will be operational shortly after that in the skies above Iraq and Syria.

Regulation of Remotely Piloted Aircraft (RPA) and Remotely Piloted Air Systems (RPAS) In recent years there has been a significant growth in the use of Remotely Piloted Aircraft (RPA) both for military and civil purposes. In the military context there are a number of Remotely Piloted Air Systems (RPAS) that were acquired urgently for use in Operations that are now being brought into core and which deliver a range of vital military capabilities. In the commercial context, advances in mobile and cellular technology have enabled development of small RPA such that they can now be purchased cheaply by any enthusiast online or in electronics and toy shops. These small RPA are being used to fulfil a wide range of tasks from casual leisure use, professional media and journalism, survey and inspection to the provision of security services. In the coming years it is expected that both military and civil usage of large and small RPA will continue to grow and proliferate and, while it is entirely appropriate that they do so, the increased use of these RPA is not without risk which must be managed appropriately; examples of such risks include the threat posed to manned aviation, the potential danger to parties on the ground and privacy concerns associated with the data they may collect in civil use. The Military Aviation Authority (MAA) is the regulator for the Defence Air Environment (DAE1) and the regulations covering military registered RPA and RPAS

The Defence Technical Training Change Programme The Secretary of State for Defence announced on the 9th September the future of the Defence College of Technical Training (DCTT) and its Defence Technical Training Change Programme (DTTCP).

The DCTT comprises of four schools: the Defence School of Aeronautical Engineering (DSAE); the Defence School of Communications and Information Systems (DSCIS); the Defence School of Electronic and Mechanical Engineering (DSEME); and the Defence School of Marine Engineering (DSMarE). These schools are based in locations across the UK, at HMS SULTAN in Gosport, RAF Cosford, MOD St Athan and Blandford, Bordon and Arborfield Garrisons.

The Royal Electrical & Mechanical Engineers (REME) schools are in the process of moving from Bordon and Arborfield to MOD Lyneham, under Tranche 1 of the DTTCP.

The DTTCP was originally established to take forward one of the key outcomes from the Defence Training Review; the need to transform the way technical training is delivered to the Armed Forces. The programme continues to seek ways to: rationalise the training estate in line with Defence objectives; reduce the military manpower involved in the delivery of training; reduce the time taken for personnel to be trained; and maintain training to the standards required by all three Services.

Rationalisation of the technical training estate was being implemented in a phased manner, split into a series of 'tranches', the first being the relocation of the REME Schools from Bordon and Arborfield to MOD Lyneham. For the subsequent tranches of the programme, the intent had been for consolidation of additional DCTT elements at MOD Lyneham. It had been planned that three subsequent DTTCP tranches would see the move of DCTT training delivered at the four schools located at RAF Cosford, Blandford Garrison, HMS SULTAN and MOD St Athan onto MOD Lyneham. Re-evaluation of the future tranches of the programme, however, has determined that the consolidation of the whole of DCTT onto a single site at MOD Lyneham is not the best solution.

The revised DTTCP will result in the Defence School of Marine Engineering and the Royal Naval Air Engineering & Survival Equipment School remaining at HMS Sultan. It will also see No. 1 School of Technical Training, the Aeronautical Engineering & Management Training School and the No. 1 Radio School remaining at RAF Cosford and subject to further work, these schools will be joined at RAF Cosford by No. 4 School of Technical Training from MOD St Athan.

13. MONUMENT PLAQUE UNVEILING – RAF MARINE CRAFT AT 1102 MCU FALMOUTH

6 September was a day to remember for many who gathered at the unveiling of the Monument Plaque to mark the service of the RAF Marine Craft at 1102 MCU Falmouth. With Air Marshal Sir Dusty Miller in attendance together with Cornish dignitaries, a dedication to the Monument was made by Reverend Wing Commander Andrew Turner. Grateful thanks go to Lance Smale from our Falmouth Branch who played a key role in ensuring the Association was front and centre!
