1. AIR VICE-MARSHAL SIR JOHN SEVERNE KCVO OBE AFC DL

It is with sadness that we report the passing of Air Vice-Marshal Sir John Severne who died recently aged 90. He was President of the South West Area of the RAF Association in the late '80s and early '90s and the Mid-Somerset Branch President from 2002 until his passing. Sir John was a very active Area and Branch President and did much to strengthen relations between local ATC squadrons and the Association.

Sir John's career in the RAF ranged from post-war fighters and jet trainers to the Nimrod maritime patrol aircraft. In addition to the 32 service aircraft types, he flew 39 different civilian light aircraft. He first flew the Mosquito night fighter with 264 Squadron for two years, before leaving for the Central Flying School (CFS). He trained as a flying instructor and spent the next few years teaching student pilots before returning to CFS to train instructors. Sir John became a Cold War fighter pilot with No 98 Squadron, flying Venom day fighter/ground attack aircraft based in northern Germany close to the Iron Curtain. During this time he was awarded the Air Force Cross for his gallantry in crash landing a burning Venom, to preserve the aircraft for crash investigators. After a year in the personnel department of the Air Ministry, Sir John was appointed to be Equerry to the Duke of Edinburgh. After a series of senior command posts in the RAF he was appointed Captain of the Queen's Flight. Sir John travelled worldwide with members of the Royal family and retired after seven years, at which point he was advanced to KCVO. Sir John's retirement to Somerset was almost as busy as his service life. As well as his work with the Association, he served as a Deputy Lieutenant of the County from 1991 to 2001 and was Honorary Air Commodore of No. 3 Maritime Headquarters of the Royal Auxiliary Air Force.






2. MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

and will meet with a beneficiary to listen to what they need and help to identify ways to connect them to others to promote friendship groups. In addition, Befrienders could also help to provide some practical assistance or just a listening ear themselves.

The Association is formalising this scheme, recognising much of this wonderful work is happening already within Branch and Club welfare teams. One of the benefits to Branches and Clubs will be a one day training course to provide practice updates and expectations of the role, information about the different

age groups that may need support, guidance on how to establish the need of someone and how to achieve the outcome they are looking for and additional resources and help for volunteers already doing this.

<u>Why Befriending now?</u> The Association is responding to research published by the Royal British Legion in 2014 which stated that isolation and loneliness is particularly acute amongst the ex- service community with one in six reporting some relationship/isolation difficulty, this being the equivalent to around 770,000 people. The research suggests that this is particular prevalent in areas of transition into civilian life and older veterans.

On the other side of the spectrum Young Minds carried out a survey in 2014, and their findings can be summarised in the following quote "talking to hundreds of people on social networks is not like having a real relationship and when they are using these sites they are often alone in their bedrooms". Because of this research, Community Support, on stations, is keen to get involved with Befriending and support the Association's Scheme – they also recognise the benefits that volunteering will bring to those doing it. We will be launching the scheme initially to serving personnel, and then rolling it out to the wider RAF family and the public, next year.

Branches will continue to support their communities with the visits they currently do, keeping people involved in the RAF family, however, more support will be provided for them as well as new members of the team, helping those welfare officers and caseworkers who do not have enough time to regularly visit everyone they meet. Look out for more information on the RAF Association website, from 1st December.

6. FINAL WINGS RETURN FOR 2015

Please have your Branch's final Wings monies returned to the Wings Appeal team at Leicester by **Friday 13 November 2015**. This will enable them to process all 2015 income and close your Branch's Wings account for the year in preparation for producing the Branch's annual Wings statement.

You can return Wings monies either through the Wings Portal or by using the Wings Returns (WR) packs. Instructions on both of these methods are below with the WR packs having been sent to your Branch Wings Appeal Organiser in their September Newsletter.

Wings Portal

We are pleased to announce that the Wings Portal is complete and ready to use. It will enable Branch committees to complete their Wings Appeal returns online, saving time and getting the Branch welfare rebate back guicker.

The Wings Portal works as follows:

- One committee member populates the portal with the details of the Branch's Wings Appeal return and states whether the Branch wishes to claim any expenses or welfare rebate from the monies being submitted.
- The portal then automatically emails another member of the Branch committee who logs into the system to check the submission. If the second committee member agrees with the details then they simply click 'Authorise'.
- A Direct Debit authorisation is built into the system so the monies the Branch are submitting for the Wings Appeal are collected automatically from the Branch bank account. Any requests for expenses or welfare rebate are paid back to the Branch via electronic transfer within 28 days of the submission, with receipts being sent to the Branch officials.
- Full instructions on the use of the system are available on the portal itself in the form of a video tutorial.

We encourage all Branches to register on the portal to start benefiting from the following:

- The ability to fill out Wings returns from home on your PC, Mac or tablet device at a time convenient to you.
- A simpler process with the portal validating and checking your figures as you input them.

- Save on paperwork and postage as no cheques or paper forms are needed.
- It helps with Branch finances as it allows Branches to claim for expenses or welfare rebates when submitting Wings monies, rather than waiting until the end of the year.
- Better visibility of the Branch's Wings Appeal returns as the system allows you to view previous submissions from the current or previous Wings years.

Please relay this information to your Branch committee at your earliest opportunity, especially to those involved in the completion of Wings returns. Any members of your Branch committee can register with the portal, but the system does require a minimum of two committee members per Branch. It is easy to access and register with the Wings Portal. Simply log in to the members area of the RAF Association website www.rafa.org.uk/Account/logon, select 'Member resources' from right hand menu and scroll down to 'Wings Portal'.

Wings Appeal paper returns

Not all Branch committees will want to submit their Wings returns online. Therefore, the Branch Wings Appeal Organiser received a Wings Returns (WR) pack in their September Wings newsletter. This pack will replace the old Wings Appeal forms which were coded WA1 – WA5. Please do not continue to use these previous 'WA' forms.

The Wings Returns (WR) pack captures the same information as the previous format but is laid out differently to mirror the layout of the Wings Portal. Instructions on how to fill in the forms are included in the pack. Please relay this information to the branch committee at your earliest opportunity, especially to those involved in the completion of Wings returns.

7. TACTICAL SUPPLY WING (TSW) STAFFORD RAFA COMMITTEE BY CPL GAV PROCTER

The TSW RAFA Committee consists of 12 Committee members which is also supported by personnel from the wider Wing assisting in fundraising events, and providing support to Stafford, Stone, Cannock, Leek and Newcastle-Under-Lyme RAFA branches. The committee over the past 6 months has been actively involved with our local branches to ensure our relationship and communication continues to strengthen.

2015 has been a great year for raising money and awareness for RAFA with TSW helping to raise over £6000 by conducting local collections at supermarkets, stores, county shows and organising a cake sale, with the majority being taken at Stafford. Some of our personnel also conduct fundraising events with their local Cadets in support of RAFA. I am always amazed at the generosity of the local communities and the support they show towards the RAF and RAFA. TSW continue to support local fundraising events and identify fundraising opportunities, which although at times proves quite challenging alongside our existing commitments, our dedicated personnel nevertheless pull out all the stops to ensure maximum support is provided to RAFA.
