4. VOLUNTEERING UPDATE

Volunteering Launch - This month marks the official launch of the Befriending Service at the Lords and Commons Dinner on 8 March. A number of high profile delegates will be attending, including the Chief of the Air Staff. This month we are also going to be ramping up communications around all volunteering opportunities and making sure the public hear about what the Association does and how they can help us.

We have a new website and registration system where volunteers can easily get involved and sign up for a variety of roles such as a Caseworker, Fundraising Team Leader or Befriender.

Befriending - Since our soft launch in December, we have been fortunate to have over 100 potential new volunteers come forward. 80 potential Befrienders are in contact with us and we are working with them to find out how they can help us and where they can visit members of the RAF family. After the official launch of Befriending this month, our welfare teams will then be matching up those who need a visit with a volunteer who has time to help. We will keep you updated on progress.

Volunteer Audit - Thank you to everyone who has contacted us over the past couple of months to inform us of who you are and how you help the Association. Many Branches have completed the volunteer survey forms and told us who is undertaking which role for their Branch. We are going to officially thank all our volunteers in National Volunteers Week (1-7 June) and so we would like to hear from as many of our Branches as possible. A Word from our Area Volunteer Co-Ordinator – Graeme Russell

Many of you will be aware of the Area Volunteer Coordinators and the work they do. I am one of three and cover the Wales, Midland and South Western Area. Over the last couple of months, since I joined, I have been busy building contacts with a range of local volunteer centres, community groups and other local organisations where we may recruit volunteers. My role helps to raise awareness of the Association, our work and the volunteering roles in which people can get involved to support the RAF family.

My role firstly has been focused on recruiting volunteers for roles in Wales, with the priority of my time given to recruit new Honorary Welfare Officers/Caseworkers where we don't currently have Branch coverage. This year there will also be a recruitment campaign focussed on recruiting Befrienders to support our welfare work. I am also focussing on recruiting Fundraising Team Leaders and Fundraisers for organising and collecting for the Wings Appeal, in locations where we do not currently have collections taking place.

I am also working alongside the Branch Support Officers, to offer additional support to Branches, helping support Branches with their recruitment of volunteers and making best use of the networks and local contacts I am establishing. 11. HMRC ALCOHOL WHOLESALER REGISTRATION SCHEME

Clubs may have received letters from their brewery regarding this scheme. We know that Coors have sent letters out to the majority of their customers. This matter is unlikely to affect RAF Association Clubs although we appreciate that brewers such as Coors are simply undertaking a compliance exercise by informing Clubs of this matter. Clubs should therefore not be concerned if their brewery writes to them regarding the scheme.

The Alcohol Wholesaler Registration Scheme was introduced on 1st January 2016 by HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) to tackle alcohol fraud. It only applies to alcohol wholesalers – businesses which sell alcohol to other businesses. Clubs are therefore not likely to be affected. However, should a Club sell alcohol to another business then they will need to register with HMRC.

From 1st April 2017, Clubs must make sure that any UK wholesalers or businesses they use to purchase buy alcohol are approved by HMRC under this scheme. We do not anticipate that any RAF Association Club will have to change its procedures as a result of this situation and Clubs are likely to be able to continue to buy from their existing suppliers without any problems. 14. RAFALO UPDATE

This is the latest edition of the RAFALO Update, which includes information on changes to the Service. On 18 Jan 16 MinDPV announced the closures of the following RAF sites:

o Hullavington Airfield – during 2016.
o RAF Barnham - within this Parliament.
o RAF Alconbury - following US withdrawal.
o RAF Molesworth - following US withdrawal.
o RAF Mildenhall - partial closure following US withdrawal.

The USVF withdrawal of Alconbury, Molesworth and Mildenhall had previously been announced as part of the European Infrastructure Consolidation (EIC) Review in Jan 15. This announcement confirms our commitment to release MOD estate and that there is no requirement for retaining Alconbury and Molesworth. Mildenhall will face partial closure as a potential defence requirement is being considered for the site. The overall aim is to reduce the estate by 30%. A full list of sites affected will be announced later in the year. In addition to the RAF sites listed above the sites to be closed are confirmed as: Kneller Hall (Military School of Music); Claro Barracks; Deverell Barracks; Lodge Hill; Craigiehall; Nelson Wardroom; and MOD Feltham. The Transfer of Number 202 (Reserve) Squadron Numberplate. On the disbandment of the Search and Rescue (SAR) Force, the 202 (Reserve) Squadron numberplate will move to the Search and Rescue Training Unit (SARTU), an element of the Defence Helicopter Flying School forward-based at RAF Valley.

The RAF SAR Force disbanded on 18 Feb 16. With its greater seniority, a joint RN / RAF heritage, and a shared background in both training and operations, 202 (Reserve) Squadron is the most suitable squadron numberplate to be bestowed upon SARTU. 202 (Reserve) Squadron will become the Maritime and Mountains Training Squadron operating the Griffin helicopter, delivering basic maritime and mountain flying skills to all DHFS outputs and a full operational SAR training package in support of 84 Squadron in Cyprus. In 2 years' time, the 202 (Reserve) Squadron will transition into the rotary wing element of the Military Flying Training System, with a new, more capable aircraft, and will continue to lead in the delivery of Defence's maritime and mountains training.

202 (Reserve) Squardon's origin is No 2 Squadron Royal Naval Air Service (RNAS), formed at Eastchurch on 17 Oct 1914. In Nov 1916 it became No 2 Wing and moved to Dunkirk, flying reconnaissance, bombing and escort sorties. On 1 April 1918, the Wing was renumbered 202 Squadron RAF. During World War 2, the Squadron maintained its maritime role, undertaking U-boat patrols in the Mediterranean and off the west coast of Northern Ireland. The Squadron's helicopter pedigree began in 1959 operating the Whirlwind HAR10 in the SAR role from RAF Finningley, Coltishall, Acklington and Leuchars. The Whirlwind was replaced by Sea King HAR3s in 1978-9. The SAR restructure in 2008 left 202 Squadron with flights at Boulmer, Lossiemouth and Leconfield until the completion of SAR operations in Dec 2015.

No 591 SU Transfers to 38 Gp. No 591 SU is the RAF's Defensive Cyber Operations Unit. No 591 Signals Unit (591 SU) transferred into No 38 Group (38 GP) with effect from 14 Jan 2016. It provides important cyber defence protection, electronic security sweeps, TEMPEST, radio OPSEC, system accreditation services and other aspects of cyber security, for all of Air Command. It also contributes to the Joint programme of defensive cyber activities. There are no plans to re-locate the Unit from its present location at RAF Digby, where it will benefit from collocation with the nascent JFC CEMA organisation.
