You may be aware that we have recently moved to a new Headquarters building in Leicester. The move was prompted by our dilapidated existing office at Loughborough Road requiring remedial maintenance at a cost far exceeding the valuation of the building. The new office is modern and open plan, and provides the additional facilities needed to deliver Council's ambitious growth plans. We have also been able to collocate the SE&E team within the wider HQ team, providing benefits to both teams. The purchase, refurbishment and move were all achieved on time and within the £2.2m budget set by Council and the new facilities will also help us to minimise operating costs going forwards.
