Please let the Area Office know if you require a list of lapsed members from your Branch in order for you to make contact, if only to check on their welfare needs. You may discover someone who really needs your help.

You will be aware that the 'Cost of membership' is to be the main topic for debate at our 70th Anniversary Annual Conference in Eastbourne on 11 May 2013. During the debate it is envisaged that a range of proposals would be discussed in order to reach an acceptable solution. Such options could include:

- An electronic copy of Air Mail is made available online through the Members login area so that Members could opt out of receiving a hard copy.
- Membership cards are not distributed annually.
- Annual Members could pay higher subscription fees (and potentially pay by monthly direct debit to spread the cost over 12 equal payments).
- Associate Members could pay more in subscription fees.
- Life Members could be asked to contribute or, say for example, that in order to receive a hard copy Air Mail, they would have to pay for it.
- Or any combination of the above.

Whatever we choose we must not single out a particular group of people, this is a Membership wide issue and that means over 65,000 of you have a view and should take the opportunity to air it.

2. WINGS APPEAL 2013

Our CHQ Community Fundraising Officer, Peter Brocklehurst, has recently issued the following information to Branch Wings Appeal Organisers:

Following on from the great success of Wings Appeal 2012, I am pleased to tell you that 2013 has started well with many Branch collections and events already having taken place. We have also had many individuals from the general public and serving RAF taking part in sponsored events such as Marathon's and cycle challenges. It is only through the hard work and commitment of our Branches that we are able to raise such fantastic amounts for the Wings Appeal and we are working hard to continue to support you in your fundraising this year.

Street Collections continue to play a vital role in enabling the RAF Association to look after those in need. If your Branch carries out this type of collection then we have again applied to the local authority area(s) for 2013 street collection permits.

All street collection permit(s) which have been received by the Wings Appeal team to date will be shown as 'Granted' and are enclosed with this letter. Any Local Authorities shown as 'Awaited' or 'Granted – Pending' have not sent us the street collection permit as yet and we are following up with these councils. Once these permits are received they will be forwarded on to you.

Past incidences have been recorded where branches have collected outside the permitted times but please note that, in order to comply with the conditions, you must **ONLY** collect on the scheduled date, time and location shown on your permit. However, please note this only applies to Public Street Collections and we would always encourage you to hold other types of collection such as premises collections at Supermarkets all year round. If you do have any concerns regarding the allocated dates or locations, or your branch is unable to undertake the collection this year, please telephone the Wings Department on 0116 268 8758 / 8757.

If your branch is undertaking a street collection, please remember that your Wings Appeal street collection returns must be at CHQ no later than 14 days after the date of your last collection. In previous years, some branches have sent in their Wings returns after the 14 day deadline but **failure to comply with this regulation may prejudice future applications for permits in your area.** In order to help meet this deadline and for your own security, we would suggest that arrangements are made to count the money on the night of the collection and the funds raised are banked as quickly as possible.

New Wings Appeal merchandise - This year we are pleased to announce that a number of new lines are being introduced to the Wings Appeal range which will sit alongside previous favourites. These include a new RAF Association 70th Anniversary Wings Appeal badge and a new Name Me Claim Me Bear dressed in a Red Arrows Flying suit. Also, we have new promotional items to help encourage donations from the public such as a RAF Association 70th Anniversary Wings lapel sticker and a Wings Appeal 'Bug'.

The 2013 order form can be used to order your Wings Appeal equipment or you can order online at www.rafashop.com. The order form shows the cost of production for each item. This will not be charged to the branch but is an indication of the cost to the RAF Association to produce each line, please keep these costs in mind when using the equipment to fundraise.

To ensure that all branches have an adequate amount of stock for their 2013 Wings collections, you will see maximum order quantities on selected items. However, we never wish to restrict your fundraising so if your branch requires larger amounts of stock due to attending large numbers of events or large scale events please call RAFATRAD directly on Tel: 01892 600 191 who will be happy to discuss your needs.

Please also ensure that when placing your Wings Order that you include the relevant set of Wings Financial Returns forms (**WAForm** - for England, Wales and N Ireland OR **SWAForm** - for Scotland). These are available either on line from RAFATRAD or on the order form under the section headed - Letters, posters & leaflets.

12. REPEAT ARTICLE - ARCTIC STAR AND BOMBER COMMAND CLASP

Further to last Month's Newsletter and a brief reference to the Arctic Star and Bomber Command Clasp, the Ministry of Defence has stressed that the message is not getting out to the relevant people. So here goes again! You are invited to follow this link for more information:

The following may be useful background. It has been announced by the Minister of State for Defence Personnel, Welfare and Veterans Mark Francois that all the details have been confirmed for the Arctic Star and the Bomber Command Clasp and the application process has now opened. This follows Sir John Holmes' independent medal review and the announcement by the Prime Minister, on 19 December 2012, that these awards should be made in recognition of the great bravery of those who contributed to two very significant campaigns of World War Two.

Her Majesty The Queen has approved designs for the new awards on the basis of recommendations made by the Royal Mint Advisory Committee. The design for the Arctic Star is based on the other World War Two Stars and the Bomber Command Clasp, to be worn on the ribbon of the 1939 to 1945 Star, follows the design of the Battle of Britain Clasp.

Production of the new Arctic Star and Bomber Command clasp will commence this week and could result in up to a quarter of a million veterans, and the families of those who have sadly died, applying to receive the new awards in recognition of their unique contribution protecting Britain during World War II. Priority in issuing the awards will be given to veterans and widows who could

receive their awards in a few weeks. Other next of kin may also apply now but will have to wait slightly longer to receive their award.

Minister of State for Defence Personnel, Welfare and Veterans Mark Francois said:

“All those who served our country in Bomber Command and on the Arctic Convoys deserve nothing but the utmost respect and admiration from us. That’s why I am delighted that these special individuals will in the next few weeks begin to receive the Bomber Command clasp and Arctic Star that they have so long deserved. I am also pleased to announce that the families of those no longer alive will also be able to apply for these awards in recognition of their loved one’s bravery.”

The qualifying period for the Arctic Star is “service of any length” recognising the particular severity of the conditions experienced by those who served in the Arctic. Whilst the primary intent is to recognise those who served on the Arctic Convoys, eligibility is extended to include all who served north of the Arctic Circle in World War Two. Those eligible will include members of all three Services as well of course as the Merchant Navy who crewed the ships taking the vital supplies to Russia.

The criteria for the Bomber Command Clasp requires prior qualification for the 1939 to 1945 Star, to which it will be affixed, with the additional requirement to have flown at least one operational sortie with a Bomber Command operational unit. A clasp was deemed more appropriate, by Sir John, in the case of Bomber Command as aircrew had already received either the Aircrew Europe Star or the France and Germany Star and another medal would have constituted “double-medalling” for the same service.

Eligible veterans and next of kin are now encouraged to apply using the relevant **application forms**, which can be found on the web link, or by telephoning the MOD Medal Office on **08457 800 900** (a local rate number) for further details. An application must be made as it is simply not possible for the MOD to contact veterans or families of all of those who may be eligible going back almost 70 years.
