## News from around the Area

## **Squadron Leader Beryl Escott**

The family of Sqn Ldr Beryl Escott would like to thank Ian Campbell, Heather Hearns and the women of the WRAF branch for their attendance and participation in the funeral of Beryl in Stratford-upon-Avon.

Beryl was born to Welsh parents in Newfoundland during a perilous snowstorm on 23 December 1929. Beryl became a Squadron Leader in the Women's Royal Air Force (WRAF) and a leading historian on women in war, painstakingly uncovering heroic exploits during WWII.

After her family's return to England in the 1930's they moved to Guernsey but escaped just days before the Nazi occupation. She continued her education in South Wales and then Yorkshire before leaving home to study at Durham University for a degree in History, English and Latin.

Although Beryl had always had a passion for writing, it was, perhaps surprisingly, her military career that actually gave her the opportunity to harness it. She was able to use her limited spare time to prepare histories of different stations, including RAF Halton House, originally built for the Rothschilds. In addition, she often advised on public relations and edited RAF newsletters.

Just before leaving the WRAF in 1986 it was suggested that she write a history of the Women's Air Force. It took almost four years to prepare this first book which was inspired by the thousands of WAAF personnel who responded to her newspaper appeals for information. In 1989 her book was published with a launch at the Imperial War Museum.

Her writing career then became the passionate focus of the next two decades, revealing for the first time the role women played in WWII, in particular the Special Operations Executive, as agents aiding the French resistance.

Beryl moved to Stratford-upon-Avon in 1980 after many years visiting the area, especially the local theatres.

After a long and debilitating illness, Beryl passed away peacefully aged 89 at the Scholars Lane Care Home.

#### Shrivenham Santa Fun Run

Setting a brisk pace around the course, Lt Col Jack Crossley from ACSC 23, B Division was our first Santa across the line in a respectable time of 17 minutes 11 seconds. Chris generously donated his prize, the RAFA Wings Appeal teddy bear, to our youngest runner 3 year old Oliver, who ran the full course alongside his proud parents. With your support and generosity we have raised over £2,200 for the RAF Assocation. Thank you.

The Shrivenham RAFA Chair, Sqn Ldr Tim Serrell-Cooke was delighted with the turnout: "It has been a great afternoon; everyone has got into the spirit of the run, which has been a truly inclusive event with Santas from across our community. One of his best memories is that on one of his birthdays he was being shot at while over the intercom his crew were singing Happy Birthday. He would do it again in a heartbeat



The more members you have the larger your rebate and the more support you can get for fundraising and events.




This 'doughnut' represents our biggest challenge – lapsed members.

The following information is provided as a guide to the pre-Conference procedure and to advise on general arrangements.

Please note that delegate packs will be sent directly to the registered delegate and resolutions will be distributed to all branches and registered delegates from 25 March 2020.

#### 1. Branch representation

All branches who wish to send a representative and/or a standard bearer to the Conference must register for Conference – see point 5 how to register.

#### 2. Expenses

Conference expenses: In accordance with Byelaw 27, the reasonable expenses of a branch committee, including those of its members attending meetings and of any delegates from the branch to Area or Annual Conferences, may be reimbursed from the branch. If any branch is experiencing financial hardship they should contact their Divisional Manager for assistance. No branch should be deterred from attending Area Conference because of financial challenges.

#### 5. Booking your accommodation:

The Chesford Grange has 205 rooms with five accessible rooms and the Association has negotiated a competitive dinner, bed and breakfast rate for the whole weekend.

The price below includes your Saturday lunch for those attending the Welfare Seminar, Friday dinner (informal), accommodation (Friday and Saturday night), breakfast and lunches (Saturday and Sunday), a formal gala dinner Saturday night, car parking and connection to the venue's WI-FI. In addition, refreshments will be available over the weekend and each bedroom offers an en-suite bathroom, TV, hairdryer, and tea/coffee.
